

Rutgers School of Nursing – 2016 NCLEX Executive Summary

A total of 270 Newark, New Brunswick, and Blackwood students (208 first-timers and 62 repeaters) took the NCLEX exam in 2016. The pass rate for this population was 83% for first-timers and 52% for repeaters, representing an overall pass rate of 76%. Students who were enrolled in the second degree program had higher pass rates than their generic degree counterparts (81% and 71%, respectively). New Brunswick first-time test takers enrolled in the generic program had the highest pass rate at 84%, followed by Newark (75%) and Blackwood (68%). However, when the second degree students affiliated with the Newark campus were added to equation, they (i.e. all Newark first-time test takers) had the highest pass rate at 85%. Educational Opportunity Fund (EOF) first-time test takers who were enrolled in the generic program at the Newark campus had a higher pass rate than those who were not enrolled (88% and 71%, respectively). However, the EOF repeat test takers had lower pass rates compared to the rest of the generic population (20% and 40%, respectively). Lastly, students' GPAs were positively correlated with their corresponding NCLEX pass rates, meaning those on the higher end of the scale were more likely to pass the exam.
